The trail is mostly level with gentle inclines along a two-track through hardwoods to an abandoned farm, then traversing a field to a path in the woods that ends at a bluff high above Lake Michigan. It is an easy walk to a beautiful view. Of course we will have lunch following, at Arts in Glen Arbor.

Directions: From the intersection of M-72 and M-22 in Empire, go south on M-22 for approximately 1.7 miles to an intersection with an abandoned white building (school??) on the southwest corner. The road from the left will have a sign-Stormer Road, the road to the right

will turn 90 degrees to the left in approximately .4 miles. At this turn, there is a gate that is the beginning of the trail. For those with GPS's, the address 13000 Norconk Rd, Empire Twp MI will get you close with Garmin. For Google Maps, 13300 Norconk Rd, Empire MI seems to work. Some systems and maps spell the road "Norcronk." Cell phone reception is spotty, but you can try Brenda's cell phone (302-943-1252) if you have difficulty finding the trailhead on Saturday.
