Traverse City is one of only two air stations that cover the Great Lakes. We are fortunate enough to have the presence of the U.S. Coast Guard right here in Traverse City.

Stay on No 4 Road until you come to a very sharp left. There is a "Scenic Overlook" sign here directing you to go straight ahead on a dirt road. Follow the dirt road until you come to a "Y" and keep to the left and you will meander south and east staying on the well-traveled section. About 1.4 miles after you left the pavement you will come to the "Overlook Parking Lot". See you there.
