WALK IN THE WOODS

September 10, 11:00 AM

The Walk in the Woods activity will take place on the second Saturday of each month in the fall and spring. Tentative plans for the fall months are: September 10th: Alligator Hill, October 8th: VASA Trail and November 12th: a little used trail to a bluff overlooking Lake Michigan. All hikes will begin at 11:00 AM, weather permitting, with lunch following.

For September, we're hoping the third time is the charm and the weather will cooperate for our walk up Alligator Hill. After two rainouts last spring we are planning this hike for September 10th. Alligator Hill, part of the old Day estate, offers excellent views of North and South Manitou Islands and Sleeping Bear Point. The 1.5 mile trail begins at the Stocking Road trailhead and gently climbs up to the lookout point where benches are available for relaxing and enjoying the view.
